

Financial Report

Monthly Budget covers:

1. Transport: \$597
 - a) to preach in Jinja, Tororo and Kampala,
 - b) to transport destitute Christians to church for worship
 - c) to transport children to school
 2. Family welfare: \$1100
 - a) Food for the family
 - b) Others (medications, clothing, house help, toiletry, etc)
 3. Utilities: \$480
(Electricity, water, postal services, communication, fuel, others)
 4. Helps to destitute brethren (emergencies not in budget but expensive, for example we had transport dead body one Christian's dead child and one lady was operated in hospital with twins, ...)
 5. School fees and scholastic materials \$790 per term after every 4 months: January, April and August)
 6. Church rent, lighting and water \$350.
- So far support comes mainly from American brethren,

Sources and Expenditures in March, 2007

A: March 7, 2007, received \$200 (delayed support for February 2007), from Church of Christ, Doniphan Missouri, and spent it as follows:

Food for family \$104

- 1) Children's school shoes \$30
- 2) Last cost on car rental \$35
- 3) Transport \$31

B: On Friday 10th March 2007, Church of Christ Cortland Ave sent \$200, Joshua and another Christian added \$200 and 500 respectively, total USD 900, received \$885 less correspondent bank charges, \$15.

Spent as follows:

- 1) Paid church building rent which was in arrears for 3 months \$511
- 2) Paid school fees for my first born daughter \$330 and
- 3) The balance spent on food for family \$44

C: On March 15, 2007, Brother Clint sent individual support of \$200 received \$185, less correspondent bank charges, and spent as follows:

- 1) Food for family \$100.
- 2) Transport and communication \$85
- 3) Bank Charge \$15

D: On March 22, 2007, Brother Clint sent individual support of \$215, and Brother Baron sent \$985 and channeled towards following needs:

- 1) School fees for Samuel, Benjamin and Mary \$470
- 2) Car hire to Tororo Church of Christ \$130
- 3) Routine movements to Lakeside Church of Christ to preach and teach, Jinja \$150
- 4) Recent debt \$250
- 5) Utilities (Electricity, water, communication, ...) \$135
- 6) Food for family \$65

E: Jalberts sent \$300 on Saturday March 24th, 2007. It helped cover:

- 1) Food \$100
- 2) Old debts \$200

F: March 28, 2007, received March support of \$200 from Church of Christ, Doniphan Missouri, and \$40 from Brother John (totals \$240). It was spent on:

Church building repairs \$150
Purchase benches and transport 90

Total received in March 2007 \$3070, all coming from American Brethren, correspondent banks charged \$60, and net received \$3010. Support came when I was in deep financial needs.

May the Almighty God reward all the brethren who have given themselves to support gospel work in Uganda, as they labor tirelessly and support us 'weak' brethren in Uganda. These brethren have obeyed the words of our Lord Jesus Christ saying, 'its more blessed to give than to receive', Acts 20:35. May God richly bless the brethren for helping growth of the gospel in Uganda.

Notes on transport expense:

1. I travel 86km away at least 4 times a week to Jinja \$277 and rent a car each Sunday to enable me travel with children to church. (Its most convenient to rent a car to Jinja each time I travel there, but needs extra \$160 per week).
2. Spend \$138 on transport, accommodation and food whenever I travel to Tororo to preach and teach.
3. Transport children to school daily, monthly cost \$32.
4. Transport Destitute Christians and children to church from their slums each Sundays and once in weekdays for prayer meetings 150
Please pray for me to get a personal automobile to
 - a) Enable me save that much, and
 - b) Save time wasted on public transport
